SAFETY OVERVIEW





WARNING - PERSONAL SAFETY

- ALWAYS wear correct personal protection equipment as needed for the task at hand and with the air tools and accessories being used.
- **ALWAYS** wear safety goggles for eye protection. Other protective equipment such as hearing protection, steel toe boots, safety apparel, work gloves and face shield are all recommended.



DANGER – AIR TANK

- The air tank becomes a pressurized vessel when in use. Always treat it with caution and respect because severe damage can cause ruptures that may lead to explosive fragments.
- NEVER attempt to repair or make modifications to the air tank or it's attached components. Welding, drilling or any other modifications may weaken the tank, which may result in damage from rupture or explosion.
- NEVER remove or attempt to adjust the pressure switch, safety valve, or other factory set operating pressures.
- ALWAYS drain liquid from air tank daily, or after each use. Failure to drain the tank will cause rust from moisture to build which will weaken the tank and lead to rupture or explosion failures,
- NEVER use an air compressor with visible damage. Including, but not limited to; dents, cracks, rust or bulges. Visible flaw is an immediate safety concern.

▲ WARNING – FIRE

- Avoid dangerous environments. Do not use compressor near gasoline or flammable materials. Normal sparking of the motor or from grinding metal could ignite fumes.
- **NEVER** spray flammable materials in the vicinity of the air compressor because it may be an ignition source.



WARNING- UNBREATHABLE AIR

- **NEVER** use this air compressor as a source for breathable air.
- This air compressor is not designed, to supply breathable quality air. Air produced by this unit may contain toxic fumes or lack sufficient oxygen levels to maintain life.



WARNING- ELECTRIC SHOCK KICKBACK

- This air compressor is powered by electricity and should never be used without properly grounded electrical connections.
- **NEVER** expose to water or use in wet or damp conditions.
- NEVER use wet hands to plug in the power cord.
- NEVER use a damaged or modified cord or plug.

▲ WARNING – PRESSURIZED AIR

- **NEVER** direct compressed air at people or pets. Extreme caution is required with air nozzles that can discharge a concentrated stream of air.
- Be aware of loose debris or dirt that can be dislodged by pressurized air and become projectiles that can cause injury or damage.
- ALWAYS wear eye protection when using an air compressor.

SAFETY OVERVIEW



WARNING – AIR TOOLS AND ACCESSORIES

- **NEVER** exceed the pressure rating on any air tools, spray guns, accessories or inflatables. Excessive pressure can cause failure or explosion resulting in
- ALWAYS be familiar with the air tools and accessories that are being used. Read the owner's manual and be familiar with the operation and function of the air tools and accessories.
- · Inspect the air hoses before use. Be aware of any damage which can lead to ruptures. Do not twist, bend, know, or modify hose. Do not wrap hose around body.



CAUTION – HOT SURFACES

- Air compressors generate significant heat during normal operation that may cause serious burns. The compressor will remain hot for sometime after
- ALWAYS assume the air compressor can be hot and handle carefully. Be especially careful around the pump, motor, and the related fittings and the connections



A CAUTION - OVERHEATING

- Do not let your air compressor overheat. Failure to do so will result in undue wear and tear, reduce life span, and can lead to component failure.
- · Air compressor's motor are air-cooled. Always ensure that the machine is operated in a well-ventilated area where it can draw a steady supply of fresh air. The arrows below show an example of locations for air flow on an engine.
- Always maintain the air filter to ensure adequate air flow into the pump.



A CAUTION - DUTY CYCLE

- The **Duty Cycle** is an expression of how much time an air compressor can be continuously ran without overheating.
- This air compressor has a 50% Duty Cycle, which means that over a ten minute time period it can safely operate for five minutes, and should rest for five minutes.
- The air compressor can be run straight without stopping, however, this will surpass the duty cycle and begin to create wear and tear from overheating.
- ALWAYS match the performance of the air compressor to the demands of the tools and applications required.

INSTALLATION & GROUNDING



Lubrication and Oil: This compressor requires no lubrication or oiling. No break in procedure is required by the user. This product is factory tested to ensure proper operation and performance.

Location of the Air Compressor: The air compressor should always be located in a clean, dry, and well-ventilated environment. The unit should have at minimum, 30cm of space on each side. The air filter intake should be free of any debris or obstructions. Check the air filter on a daily basis to be sure it is clean and in working order.

Extension Cords: We do not recommend the use of an extension cord with this product. This may result in the loss of power and overheating of the motor. An additional air hose should be used instead of an extension cord. However, if the use of an extension cord is unavoidable, use only UL listed wire extension cords that have three-pronged grounding type plugs and three prong receptacles that accept the tool's plug. Improper use of extension cords may cause inefficient operation of your compressor, which can result in overheating.

Be sure your extension cord is rated to allow sufficient flow to motor. Refer to the guide for minimum gauge required for extension cords.


Use of an extension cord heavy enough to carry the current the tool will draw is very important. Especially when the power source is of great distance. An extension cord that is insufficient will cause a drop in line voltage, resulting in power loss and causing the motor to overheat.

Guard against electrical shock. Avoid body contact with grounded surfaces such as pipes, radiators, ovens, stoves, and refrigerator enclosures. If not properly grounded, this power tool can incur the potential hazard of electrical shock, particularly when used in damp locations. If an electrical shock occurs, there is the potential of a secondary hazard such as your hands contacting an operating air tool.

Grounding Instructions: This product should be grounded. In the event of an electrical short circuit, grounding reduces the risk of electric shock by providing an escape wire for the electric current. This product is equipped with a cord having a grounding wire with an appropriate grounding plug. The plug must be plugged into an outlet that is properly installed and grounded in accordance with all local codes and ordinances. Check with a qualified electrician or service personnel if these instructions are not completely understood or if in doubt as to whether the tool is properly grounded.

OPERATION



Start-Up Procedures

- 1. Set the On/Off switch to the off position.
- 2. Check the air compressor visually for any damage or obstruction.
- 3. Close the drain valve.
- 4. Plug the power cord into the proper receptacle.
- 5. Turn the On/Off switch to the On position and the compressor should start
- 6. The machine will start and build air pressure.
- 7. Adjust the regulator to a PSI setting that is recommended for your application.
- 8. The air compressor is now ready for use.

WARNING Improper installation of the grounding plug can result in a risk of electric shock. If repair or replacement of the cord or plug is necessary, do not connect the grounding wire to either flat blade terminal. The wire with insulation having an outer surface that is green with or without yellow stripes is the grounding wire. Check with a qualified electrician or serviceman if the grounding instructions are not completely understood, or if in doubt as to whether the product is properly grounded. Do not modify the plug provided; if it will not fit the outlet, have the proper outlet installed by a qualified electrician.

Shut-Down Procedures

- 1. Set the Auto-On/Off lever to the Off position.
- 2. Unplug the power cord from the receptacle.
- 3. Set the outlet pressure to zero on the regulator.
- 4. Remove any air tools or accessories.
- 5. Open the drain valve allowing air to bleed from the tank. After all of the air has bled from the tank, close the drain valve to prevent debris buildup in the valve. Water that remains in the tank during storage will corrode and weaken the air tank, which could cause the tank to rupture. To avoid serious injury, be sure to drain the tank after each use or daily.

CAUTION When draining the tank, always use ear and eye protection. Drain the tank in a suitable location; condensation will be present in most cases of draining.

1 Year
